#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. Improved swale and new bollard lighting
- 2. Footpaths through existing woodland (~932m)
- 3. Multiuse trails (~977m)
- 4. Pathways with central focal point/seating (~242m)
- 5. Wildflower meadow
- 6. Wooded areas to be thinned
- 7. Wildflower laybrinth
- 8. Expansion of orchard and fruit shrubs
- 9. Pathways, seating and labels in arboretum
- 10.Reconfigured and paved parking
- 11.Relocated barn
- 12.Overflow parking / skating rink
- 13.Relocated gazebo with formal plantings
- 14.Outdoor classroom with log benches
- 15.Removal of existing cedar hedge
- 16.Increased winter interest in butterfly garden
- 17.New box culvert and dredging
- 18.Increased riparian buffer
- 19. Fountain jet and large boulders as informal seating
- 20. Evergreen hedging to buffer traffic noise







PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES

- 1. Aboretum pathways, labelling and seating areas
- 2. Relocated gazebo with new plantings
- 3. Entrance walkway with arbour, planting and welcome sign
- 4. Wayfinding signage / park map
- 5. Reconfigured and paved parking area
- 6. Informal outdoor gathering area with sun shelter
- 7. Overflow parking / skating rink in winter
- 8. Reconfigured existing parking area
- 9. Relocated garbage disposal area with wooden screening
- 10.Expansion of existing deck
- 11.Outdoor classroom area
- 12. Multiuse trails to connect to existing
- 13.Footpaths through existing woodland
- 14.Removal of existing cedar hedge
- 15.Added evergreen/perennial winter interest in butterfly garden
- 16.New bollard lighting along river trail
- 17.New culvert and dredgring to improve pond health
- 18. Fountain jet for aeration and large boulders as informal seating
- 19.Increased buffer around pond & sculptural elements (e.g. bird houses)
- 20.Increased evergreen planting along Bunbury Rd.






1 Concept Plan - Enlargement A L1a Scale: 1:500

PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. New swale and bollard lighting along river trail
- 2. Footpaths through existing woodland
- 3. New multiuse trail to connect to exisitng
- 4. Diagonal paths through NE, with focal point and seating area
- 5. New boardwalk along trail to river to pass over low,
- 6. Expansion of orchard and fruit shrubs
- 7. Perennial, pollinator-friendly laybrinth
- 8. New specimen tree and shrub plantings
- 9. Wooded area to be thinned
- 10.Wildflower meadow area
- 11.Arboretum pathways, labelling, and seating.
- 12.Increased evergreen planting along Bunbury Road to decrease noise and view of traffic.








## PONDSIDE PARK

#### PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**


- 1. Wildlife habitat island added to pond during dredging
- 2. Fountain jets for aeration and visual interest
- 3. Increased riparian buffer / no mow zone
- 4. Elevated viewing decks overlooking pond
- 5. Leaping frog public art piece added at park entrance
- 6. Multiuse pathway to connect to watershed trails (~700m total)
- 7. Reconfigured entrance with median and public art
- 8. Relocated mailboxes and pullover area
- 9. Entrance sign and planting
- 10.Permeable parking area with central median
- 11.Remove north wall and add planting/murals to south walls of picnic shelter
- 12. Specimen tree plantings and picnic area
- 13.Low, flowering hedge along tennis courts
- 14.Relocated playground area
- 15.Gravel parking area
- 16. Evergreen and shrub plantings to screen water building
- 17.Picnic area with specimen tree plantings / removal of existing chainlink fence
- 18. Open area for informal play
- 19. Future parking for pump track, if required
- 20. Relocated gate to prevent unauthorized access to water building
- 21. Pump track / children's ski area in winter
- 22. Fencing and planting to surround existing wells (location approximate)








## TEAHILL PARK EXISTING CONDITIONS








## TEA HILL PARK PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. Large, natural entrance planting and sign
- 2. New bike lane (~541m) and solar lighting
- 3. Turnaround zone
- 4. Tree plantings SW of lane
- 5. Naturalized area / potential off-leash dog park
- 6. New parking area with permeable paving
- 7. Overflow and/or future parking
- 8. Large open area for festival or passive recreation
- 9. Tree planting continued length of lane
- 10.Drop off zone with central entrance feature
- 11.Bandstand / picnic shelter with bench seating
- 12.BBQ picnic areas
- 13.Expanded no mow zone to increase riparian buffer
- 14. New evergreen tree plantings to expand wooded area to north
- 15.Removable walkway for universal beach access




## TEA HILL PARK PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. New bike lane to connect to active transportation link
- 2. Large, natural entrance planting with integrated signage
- 3. Turnaround zone
- 4. New bike lane and solar lighting along lane
- 5. Foot paths through naturalized area (~435m)
- 6. Naturalized area to build on existing meadow
- 7. Potential fenced in zone as off-leash dog park
- 8. Tree plantings along the SW side of lane
- 9. Low blueberry hedge along NW side of lane
- 10. New parking area in permeable paving
- 11.Overflow and/or future parking
- 12. Large open area for festivals or passive recreation
- 13. Tree planting to continue length of NE side of lane



#### PRELIMINARY CONCEPT


#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**


- 1. Drop off zone with turnaround
- 2. Central entrance planting with sculptural element
- 3. Low blueberry hedge to frame drop off zone
- 4. New specimen tree plantings and removal of old playgorund pad
- 5. New bike rack to replace existing
- 6. Welcome and/or interpretative sign
- 7. Decorative, hardy tree planting along south face of building
- 8. Bandstand / picnic shelter with bench seating
- 9. BBQ picnic areas
- 10. Multiuse trail to extend directly to beach (~74m)
- 11.Expansion of no mow zone to increase riparian buffer
- 12. Evergreen tree plantings to expand on existing NE wooded area
- 13. Removable walkway for universal beach access

#### PRELIMINARY CONCEPT

#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. Seating nooks with log benches
- 2. Meadow area with specimen plantings
- 3. Multiuse trails to connect to existing trails (~540m)
- 4. Natural playground expansion
- 5. Mixed wildflower meadow area
- 6. Footpaths through woods and meadow (~2140m)
- 7. Expansion of existing orchard / community garden
- 8. Redefinition of service lane as main entryway
- 9. Paved expansion of existing parking to replace gravel
- 10.Demonstration argricultural field (e.g. habitat strips as integrative pest management)
- 11. Areas designated for reforestation
- 12.Small foot bridge
- 13. Proposed snowmobile circulation route and crossings
- 14.Picnic shelter / outdoor gathering area
- 15. Waves of monochromatic wildflower seedings targeted to different pollinators (e.g. monarch butterfly specific seeding)
- 16.Floating boardwalk






#### **DESIGN REFERENCE NOTES**

- 1. Community notice board / consolidated signage
- 2. Entrance gate, pillars, welcome sign and planting
- 3. Tree plantings lining main entrance walk
- 4. Expanded paved parking and living fence to replace white posts
- 5. Mixed wildflower meadow area
- 6. Seating area with log bench
- 7. Multiuse trail to connect to exisitng trails
- 8. Areas designated for reforestation
- 9. Shrub plantings to camouflage chainlink fencing
- 10.Demonstration agricultural fields: habitat strips with integrated pest management, fruit tree guilds and food forest demos.
- 11.Demonstration agricultural field: experimental crops
- 12.Community garden with pergola and central gathering area
- 13. Future expansion of existing orchard
- 14. Proposed snowmobile circulation and crossings

- 6. Natural playground expansion
- 7. Mixed wildflower meadow area
- 8. Flowering native trees to line trail and screen fencing
- 9. Areas designated for reforestation
