## 7. <u>MAYOR'S</u> REPORT

Included in the package for Council to review. Mayor Jenkins stated that he attended the National FCM Board meeting last week in Jasper. He noted that he sits on the Safety and Prevention Committee and the Social Economic Development Committee. There were presentations made at both these committees and Mayor Jenkins noted that he brought back some documents on their Diversity Program, as he feels that it might aid our new Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

### 8. CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

Included in the package for Council to review. Robert noted that there has been further training, and although our training is not complete, we do plan to conduct our October Council meeting electronically.

It was also noted that there was a meeting this morning with members of the Stratford business community and the Chamber of Commerce. Robert noted that we have been working with the Chamber to see if it is possible to set up a Stratford Business Committee within the Chamber, so we could have a liaison with the business community. It was a positive meeting and we will be moving forward.

Councillor Ross asked if we would check our business listing, as his two businesses did not receive an invitation. Robert noted that we did send our list to the Chamber of Commerce and they extended the invitation to the business community, but we will follow up to confirm that the list is up to date.

## 9. PUBLIC WORKS

#### a) Report

A report was circulated and Deputy Mayor MacDonald gave a brief overview noting that the sidewalk repairs have been completed, with the exception of a few driveway approaches.

Deputy Mayor MacDonald noted that due to the heavy rains there are areas in the Town where grass could not be cut. He added that our buildings survived the heavy rain without any major problems, but we did discover a leak in the roof of the maintenance building, which has since been repaired.

It was noted that there was a meeting held last night regarding the Woodlane/ Emmalee and Mitchell Drive water problem, and the Provincial Department of Transportation and Public Works was in attendance. There were approximately 50 people who attended the meeting and Deputy Mayor MacDonald believes that the majority of people were satisfied with the plan to correct the problem.

Mayor Jenkins asked for an update on sidewalk paving and Jeremy noted that he met with DOT and we will not be receiving any ditch in-filling this year, as the money has now been earmarked for the project on Woodlane Drive and Emma Lee Drive. The Georgetown Road bike lane was also discussed and we are hoping that DOT will cost share in this project. The trail selections we selected are now being surveyed and we hope to have the tender out by the end of the month. The Shakespeare concrete sidewalk project has been delayed because of the heavy rains, but it should be able to get underway this week.

Councillor Ross asked if we had planned to have some ditch in-filling done this year before the Woodlane/Emmalee project took priority, and Jeremy replied that we plan to have some done every year, however, the province did not commit to us that they would be doing any ditch in-filling this year. Councillor Ross expressed concern that Stratford is not getting its' fair share of provincial infrastructure. Mayor Jenkins noted that a letter to Minister MacKinley was drafted requesting a meeting to discuss and offer our input into their five year capital plan.

Councillor Clow took a moment to thank Jeremy and all his staff for all their hard during the heavy rains.

## 10 STRATFORD UTILITY CORPORATION

### a) Report

Included in the package for Council to review. Councillor Ross noted that he, Kim O'Connell, Jeremy Crosby and Deputy Mayor MacDonald attended the Bunbury water project announcement in Crapaud. It was great that the announcement has been made and the tenders will be going out the first of next week.

Councillor Ross reiterated Councillor Clow's remarks thanking the Utility staff for all their hard work during the heavy rain and looking after the issues the rain had caused.

### b) Financial Report

A copy of the financial statements was included in the package. Mayor Jenkins noted that the formatting of the statements makes them hard to read and Kim replied that this is the new version of Town Suite and that they are working to solve the problem.

Kim noted that eleven disconnect notices were sent out and we are still waiting to hear from five residents.

### 11. <u>RECREATION REPORT</u>

#### a) Report

A complete written report was included in the package for Council to review. Councillor Clow noted that staff has been very busy hosting special events and tournaments. We held our first national junior baseball championships from August 14 - 17 at MacNeill Field and it was extremely challenging due to the heavy rains and late preparation of the venue. However, this event has given staff the confidence to hold these types of tournaments in the Town. Ten games were hosted in the Town over the four days of competition.

Councillor Clow noted that we are celebrating our first year with our dog park and there

are plans to have lights installed in the park later this month.

It was noted that last weekend there was a *Registration Expo* held in the gymnasium. The aim of the expo was to inform Stratford residents about all the various volunteer opportunities that exist in Stratford, as well as provide residents with a chance to register for numerous activities, clubs, groups and sports offered in the Town of Stratford. Approximately 30 groups attended the expo and expressed an interest in attending again next year.

Councillor Clow noted that the funding was announced for the Indoor Soccer Facility and this facility will be a great asset to the Town.

Councillor Ross congratulated the recreation staff for keeping 'on top of things' during the junior nationals. As noted earlier it was challenging due to some issues, but the staff did a great job.

Councillor Ross asked Ron if he could look into why the Soccer Association is collecting the soccer jersey's at the end of the year, and Ron replied that he is not sure why they collect them, but he will followup with the Soccer Association.

Councillor Clow took a moment to congratulate the Stratford Youth-Can-Do. Once again they had a float in the Gold Cup and Saucer parade and it was chosen the best community and organization entry. He stated that he would like to see the Town provide some additional funds to Youth-Can-Do to help them add to their float each year, as the float represents the Town.
