1. CALL TO ORDER

Deputy Mayor McMillan called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3. PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Robert O'Hanley introduced himself and stated that he lives on Sundance Lane. I do have a concern because we are talking about tax rates. The tax burden that I am paying is very onerous. It was close to \$5,000 last year and has increased substantially since we moved to the area - my assessment has gone up 35% in five years. As I mentioned to the Deputy Mayor preceding the meeting my concern is if we keep this geometric increase it is going to drive me out of this Town. There is a limit to what I can pay and I do get concerned when I go through the proposed budgets, as some of the expenses seem extremely large and this isn't the right forum to go through it line by line, but I would like the opportunity to remind Council that there is a limit to what people can pay, and I'm getting to my limit. I like where I live and I would not want to be forced out simply because more money is being taken out of my pocket. I would ask that Council bear that in mind. We are not talking just about numbers here. We are talking about people's livelihoods. This is my money and I work very hard for it and I want to keep as much of it as I can. I realize that there are expenses that have to be funded, but this is a town - it is not an amusement park. When I went through the budget I questioned some of the expenditures - why are we spending this money - and as I say I realize that this isn't the proper form for going through that. I would just reiterate that I would ask Council in their deliberations to keep that at the forefront. This is real money that your citizens work very hard to earn. We want to keep as much of it as possible and we simply ask that our representatives are extremely diligent in managing costs and be very thoughtful when they are considering expenditures. Deputy Mayor McMillan thanked Mr. O'Hanley for his comments. We are mindful that we

have to provide good services for the money we are asking residents to pay. We are trying to maintain a balance and we need to be kept accountable, and we appreciate your remarks.

4. Resolution FA007-2009 - Revised 2009 Operating Budget and 2009 Property Tax Rates

Moved by Councillor Patrick Ross Seconded by Councillor Emile Gallant

WHEREAS in 1995 the Province and the Town negotiated a Comprehensive Urban Services Agreement (CUSA) wherein the Town accepted full responsibility for municipal services including police, land use planning and recreation services and the Province allocated a \$0.20 per \$100 of assessed non-commercial realty tax credit to the Town to fund those services; and

WHEREAS in 2008 the Province unilaterally, and without consultation, reversed the 1995 CUSA agreement and took back the \$0.20 per \$100 of assessed non-commercial realty tax credit and replaced it with a grant; and

WHEREAS the Town understood that the revenue from the grant would consider inflation and assessment growth and would therefore result in revenue similar to that which it received under the CUSA agreement; and

WHEREAS the 2009 Town Operating Budget was passed on January 14, 2009, which included a revenue item of \$943,900 for the Municipal Support Grant from the Province based on the forecast of assessment growth and assuming that the grant would not be materially different from the CUSA revenue; and

WHEREAS the Department of Community Cultural Affairs advised the Town, in a letter dated February 11, 2009, that the amount of the grant that we will receive for 2009 is \$924,957 based on the provinces fiscal year ending on March 31. The amount of money that the Town of Stratford will receive in the 12 month period of January to December 2009 is \$919,100 (3 months @ \$75,126.33 per month - 2008 per monthly grant amount +9 months @ \$77,079.75 per month - 2009 grant amount). This municipal grant calculation caused a shortfall in our 2009 budget of \$24,800; and

WHEREAS the Town of Stratford must have a balanced budget so each department had to revise their budgets for 2009 to cover the shortfall in the Municipal Support Grant.

BE IT RESOLVED that the attached 2009 Operating Budget be approved as follows in accordance with the attached revenue and expense tables:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the non commercial municipal tax rate be \$0.44 per \$100 of assessment for 2009.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commercial municipal tax rate be set at the same level for 2009, which is \$0.99 per \$100 of assessment.
